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First part of 2025 has been busy!

It has indeed been a very active start to the year, with the Inishowen

Development Partnership (IDP) team dedicated to promoting the People, Place, and Progress of Inishowen . During this time, we held a large number of events and courses and successfully engaged with hundreds of individuals from across the peninsula and beyond. The team continued our mission to promote the People, Place, and Progress of Inishowen through a wide range of complementary Social Inclusion & Rural Development programmes, always keeping the individual, community inclusion and wellbeing at its heart. Notable larae events included the **ChangeMakers** Annual Conference, the cross border/community IFI EMBRACE Harmony & Heritage final celebration event, the annual Inishowen Job Fair - a huge success, attracting over 400 attendees and 26 employers; and the Celebration of Learners event in Buncrana which honoured more than 100 local people, acknowledging their achievements and their dedication to personal growth. Furthermore, we initiated the rollout of the new LEADER programme aimed at stimulating & supporting sustainable & innovative rural development, building a diverse & sustainable economy, and creating greater ownership of the environment. The SICAP Small Grants Programme awarded funding to 27 Community & Voluntary groups and Social Enterprises to support a more sustainable, inclusive, and empowered community. The first ever INISHOWEN CONSTRUCTION WEEK addressed the demand for tradespeople with free and subsidised training courses, while the Active Inishowen Project began making great strides in promoting walking and cycling, developing hubs and showcasing new trails along with our community partners. Through various initiatives like the Care4Carers programme, parenting support programmes and skills training such as Payroll5, Power BI, Event Management, IT classes, and Child Safeguarding, and community consultations for projects like Eco Buncrana, IDP demonstrated a significant impact on personal development, employability, community wellbeing, and local initiatives across Inishowen. 






Webinar to support parents in talking about having defective blocks at home






Eco Buncrana consultations

ChangeMakers Donegal, who carried out the three workshops with the young people at the Youthreach base in Lisfannon, said she was really impressed by the response she had from the young people.








DCB support at Inishowen Co-Op Home Build Event in Buncrana




