This transformative project will enhance health and wellbeing services across rural Derry City & Strabane District Council area and the Inishowen region of Donegal County Council.

Led by RAPID, HARC will be delivered in collaboration with Inishowen Development Partnership, Derg Valley Care & Healthy Living Centre and Spraoi agus Spórt.

Together we aim to:

Expand rural family support and wellness services

- Provide targeted support for older people, carers and individuals with disabilities
- Utilise our natural environment for nature-based wellbeing programmes
- Strengthen rural social enterprises to build resilient communities

The Launch of the HARC project took place in the An Grianan Hotel, Donegal on Tuesday 7th October 2025, marking a significant milestone in rural development and community wellbeing across the border regions of Ireland and Northern Ireland.

HARC Family Support Programme (supporting every stage of family life)

The HARC Family support programme offers a range of tailored initiatives designed to support children, parents, older people, carers & those with health conditions.

Child Development Programmes to support parents in key child development i.e. - baby massage, baby sensory play, family nutrition, behavioural programmes, sleep support etc.

Parent Wellness & Support Programme to optimise parental mental and physical health i.e. pregnancy yoga, fitness classes, social cafes, peer support classes etc.

Summer Activity Programmes to provide children and young people with opportunities to interact with peers during school holidays i.e. cross-border activities, kayaking, hiking team-building etc.

Older People's Programme designed to ensure older people have the opportunity to engage within their community through wellbeing activities i.e. arts & crafts, exercise, baking etc.

Carer's Support Programme designed to support carers of all ages through health & wellbeing activities. 2.

HARC Health & Wellbeing Through Nature Programme

The HARC Health & Wellbeing Through Nature Programme will deliver cross border benefits by merging the local specialisms of 'Blue Care' (Inishowen) & 'Green Care' (Faughan, Sperrin & Derg).

Blue Care Therapy Programme - This inter generational programme has been designed to optimise the health & wellbeing of citizens by using the 'Blue' assets i.e. lakes and coastlines to provide activities such as, paddleboarding, kayaking, sea swimming etc.

Green Care Therapy Programme - has been designed to optimise the health & wellbeing of citizens by using the 'Green' assets i.e. mountains & forests to provide activities such as forest mindfulness, mountain climbing, cycling etc.

Cross Border Community Hiking /Walking Programme - this intergenerational programme will enable families to participate in monthly hiking and walking activities.

Eco Environmental Activity Programme - Improve your health & wellbeing whilst protecting the natural assets. Activities will include beach & forest cleansing, planting, community gardening etc.

HARC Rural Social Enterprise

Development Programme

The HARC Rural Social Enterprise Development Programme will build sectoral capacity across the target rural areas. Delivered to 15 social enterprises, this has been designed to enable rural communities to sustain & further expand key services locally.

Specialist Social Enterprise Mentoring
Programme - Each of the 15 participating social
enterprises will be provided with 24 specialist
mentoring sessions.

Social Enterprise Shared Resources Programme - Project partners will develop a shared resources framework for access by the 15 enterprises. This will enable organisations to benefit from specialist support such as budgeting, strategic planning, application development etc.

Accredited Social Enterprise Development
Modules - 3 accredited social enterprise
development modules will be delivered e.g.
Business Development, Financial Management
etc.

Social Impact Return Training Programme - Key representatives from each of the 15 social enterprises will undertake a social impact return training programme.
