This wrap-around programme is tailored to the individual needs with the emphasis on personal development for young people. Building on their personal strengths Chance offers participants a suite of opportunities – where



they are guides and advised on the next steps in their personal development. To date 36 young people aged between 16 and 25 years – who are not in employment, education or training – have been supported by Chance and the programme will continue until August 2026.



This workshop is part of this year's theme Take a Closer Look, highlighting the vital role public libraries play in supporting learning, connection, and community.




Media Literacy Training for IDP Staff with ALL Strategy


